

# 8 Solutions to Prevent Workplace Littering and Waste

### Establish Clear Policies and Expectations

- Include details on littering consequences, designated waste disposal areas, and environmental responsibilities.
- Integrate these policies into onboarding, employee handbooks, and ongoing safety talks to ensure continued reinforcement.

### **Increase the Availability of Waste and Recycling Stations**

- Partner with vendors who use minimal or recyclable packaging.

## Lead by Example

- Health & safety directors, HR supervisors, and site managers should model [appropriate waste disposal behaviours](#).
- Recognize and praise teams or individuals who actively contribute to a clean work environment.

## Provide Regular Training and Awareness Campaigns

Periodic education keeps waste management top of mind.

- Host brief sessions on the importance of proper waste disposal, recycling guidelines, and the environmental and safety impacts of litter.
- Use posters, digital displays, or email newsletters to maintain awareness throughout the year.

# Encourage Employee Ownership

Employees are more likely to maintain clean areas when they feel responsible.

- Implement a “Clean as You Go” practice, particularly in construction sites, manufacturing areas, and shared spaces.
- Assign cleaning responsibilities for communal areas on a rotating basis to foster shared accountability.

# Use Visual Management Tools

Visual cues help reinforce desired behaviours.

- Install signage that is simple, multilingual if necessary, and strategically placed to guide employees on where and how to dispose of waste.
- Floor markings, posters, and humorous or engaging reminders can improve compliance.

# Introduce Incentive Programs

Positive reinforcement can drive better engagement.

- Offer small rewards, public recognition, or even competitions (like “Cleanest Department of the Month”) to encourage participation.

- Tie environmental stewardship to your broader company culture initiatives to deepen employee buy-in.
