## To Whom You Must Report Environmental Incidents



One of an EHS coordinator's key responsibilities is ensuring that the company properly reports any environmental incidents, such as spills of hazardous substances, that are covered by the reporting requirements in the environmental law. Naturally, you must report such incidents to the appropriate government officials, such as an environmental enforcement officer. But there are other people you may also need to notify, such as the owners of any property impacted by the incident. So here's a chart of the people who you must notify of designated environmental incidents under the primary environmental law in each jurisdiction.
