# Ask The Expert: Who Should Take Body Temperature Readings for COVID-19 Screening?



## **QUESTION**

Who should take peoples' body temperature for workplace COVID-19 screening'

## **ANSWER**

No person should take temperatures unless they have proper training.

## **EXPLANATION**

This is obviously a novel situation. Based on the guidance that has emerged, this appears to be best practice for employers:

<u>First Choice</u>: Have a trained nurse or medical professional on-site to take temperatures and/or train non-medical personnel how to do it.

<u>Second Choice</u>: If you don't have trained nurses or medical professionals onsite, designate one or more management-level staffer to do the testing after receiving appropriate training that covers, at a minimum:

- How to use, wash, clean and disinfect the thermometer or temperature-taking equipment;
- How to use proper PPE for temperature-taking;
- How to interpret the results, including what to do in the event a result is out of whack with common sense, e.g., a temperature reading that is obviously too high or too low; and
- How to record the results.

Be sure to keep written documentation of the training, including:

- Who provided and received it;
- The date it was provided;
- What it covered; and

• The basis for concluding that the trainee understood and was capable of applying the training, e.g., a post-training demonstration.

Last but not least, try to deploy temperature-taking that is as minimally invasive and easy-to-use as possible, e.g., scanning systems instead of thermometers.

# Competency Checklist for COVID-19 Medical Screeners

If you're performing body temperature checks as part of COVID-19 medical screening, make sure it's done by health professionals or non-medical professionals at the site with appropriate training. Use this Checklist of required competencies to ensure temperature-takers have the necessary training.
