A chicken farm caught hell after secret media video of employees committing animal abuse went public. So the farm decided to correct the problem by requiring crews to wear surveillance cameras on the job. But a BC Privacy Commission investigative report found the program illegal'a 'quick fix' undertaken without consideration of the privacy risks to not only the employees but truckers, contractors and other third parties caught on camera [Investigation Report P17-01: Use of employee surveillance by a BC chicken catching organization, Nov. 8, 2017]
