Farmers: Let's Talk about Safety!



<u>Canadian Agricultural Safety Week</u>, which is March 9-15, 2014, is intended to raise awareness of health and safety issues in this industry. This year's theme is Let's Talk About It! Organizers want to inspire farmers to engage in conversations about safety through a combination of farmer testimonials, producer resources and videos.

One obstacle to talking about safety can be <u>language barriers</u>, especially if you hire seasonal <u>migrant workers</u> for your farm. But you can overcome language and cultural barriers through a combination of patience, accommodation and good humour. For example:

- Learn key phrases in the language of your workers
- Make ample use of pictures and videos
- Hire someone who can speak their language.

In addition, the federal government recently announced a fiveyear investment of up to \$3.4 million to the <u>Canadian</u> <u>Agricultural Safety Association</u> toward their goal of developing and promoting farm safety standards.
