Many workplaces use various types of mobile equipment, from forklifts to tractors. Such equipment can pose safety hazards if the equipment isn't properly maintained or operated. For example, if the equipment doesn't have functional seatbelts, a worker could get tossed from the equipment in an accident and seriously injured (or even killed).
