> Under the Hazardous Product Act and Controlled Products Regulations, MSDSs for 'controlled products' must include nine categories of information identified by designated headings:

- 3) Product information
- 4) Physical data
- 5) Fire or explosion hazard
- 6) Reactivity data
- 7) Toxicological properties
- 8) Preventative measures
- 9) First aid measures

GHS The information in a safety data sheet (SDS) should be presented using the following 16 headings in the following order: 1) Identification 2) Hazard identification 3) Composition/information on ingredients 4) First aid measures 5) Fire-fighting measures 6) Accidental release measures 7) Handling and storage 8) Exposure controls/personal protection 9) Physical and chemical properties 10) Stability and reactivity 11) Toxicological information 12) Ecological information 13) Disposal considerations 14) Transport information 15) Regulatory information 16) Other information
